

# I N S T R U C T I O N S

1. With computer off, disconnect standard keyboard and mouse.
2. Connect Wireless SurfBoard™ receiver to keyboard port and mouseport. If mouseport is not available, use serial port with adapter.
3. If you will use a joystick with keyboard, connect 15-pin cable from gameport to receiver.
4. Insert four batteries in keyboard and turn on computer.

## O P E R A T I O N

- Type keys as you would on any keyboard.
- Press Num Lock to turn embedded numeric keypad on and off.
- To move mouse, slide finger lightly over touchpad. Tap on touchpad to click and double-tap to double-click. To drag, tap twice but leave finger down after second tap.
- To use another mouse instead of the built-in touchpad, connect it to keyboard's mouseport.
- To use a joystick wirelessly, connect it to keyboard's gameport.

## F O R   M U L T I - U N I T   R O O M S

1. Set a second receiver to channel 2 using slide switch on bottom of receiver.
2. Set a second keyboard to channel 2 by holding down the Fn-key and pressing the Num Lock-Chan key. By default, keyboard starts on channel 1. If receiver and keyboard are on the same channel, pressing a key blinks the receiver LED.

- Position the receiver as high as possible, away from monitor and computer.
- Stretch out receiver antenna so it is horizontal (parallel to ground) and sideways to keyboard.
- Avoid configurations that place metal objects between keyboard and receiver.

F O R M A X I M U M R A N G E

T R O U B L E S H O O T I N G

- Num Lock on? After computer starts, if some keys send numbers instead of letters, press Num Lock key to turn off Num Lock.
- Keystrokes and touchpad not getting through?  
Be sure receiver connectors are not reversed, keyboard and receiver are on same channel (usually channel 1), batteries are good (keyboard LED blinks when key is pressed), and keyboard is close enough to receiver.
- Keystrokes get through but touchpad doesn't?  
In Windows 95, use the Add Hardware wizard to select Standard PS/2 Port Mouse -- or Standard Serial Mouse if receiver is on the serial port. On notebooks, use a corded mouse to verify mouseport/serial port is functioning.
- Touchpad "dead" after a period of inactivity?  
The touchpad powers down after 30 minutes.  
Press any key to wake it up.
- Keyboard LED blinks five times after every
